



Introduction:

In Scoil Choilm CNS, we would like the children to take pride in presenting themselves in full school uniform each day.

Details:

The uniform is available from 'Mr. Price' in the Blanchardstown2 Retail Park or Leddy's Uniforms, St. Brigid's Shopping Centre, Blanchardstown Village, Dublin 15

Uniform:

Our school uniform is a royal blue cardigan or jumper with a grey pinafore/ skirt or grey trousers, a white shirt and a royal blue tie.

School Tie:

The school tie is available from Mr. Price. It can also be purchased from either school office or on MIT online payments system at a cost of €5.

PE Tracksuit:

There is also a royal blue track-suit with a white polo-shirt to be worn underneath for pupils from Junior Infants to 4th Class. The tracksuit for 5th and 6th classes is navy and blue and should be worn with a white polo shirt underneath. The tracksuit may only be worn on P.E. days.

Code of Behaviour:

It is our expectation that children come to school in full school uniform each day. This rule is outlined in our Code of Behaviour, which all parents sign and agree on, upon enrolment.

Responsibilities:

It is school policy that the uniform must be worn at all times. It is teacher's responsibility to ensure that all children wear their school uniform at all times. If children are not presenting in their school uniform the teacher should phone the parent to ask them why the child is not wearing their uniform and to remind them of the importance of sending their child to school in their school uniform each day. Teachers should remind the children of the importance of wearing their school uniform each day.

It is each parent's responsibility to ensure that their child is wearing a full school uniform to school each day. In the case where the child is not in full school uniform, a note from parents is required.

It is each child's responsibility to ensure that their uniform, provided by the parents is worn in school each day.

Replacement Uniforms:

Children may need their uniforms replaced during the school day. The child will be given a replacement uniform for the day. The soiled uniform will be sent home in a plastic bag. Please wash and return the uniform that belongs to the school as soon as possible.

Non Uniform Days:

On certain days, such as Lá Glas, 'No uniform' day fundraisers or on the last day of term, children are welcome to wear their own clothes into school. Clothes should be of appropriate age for children. No heels are permitted as this can be a safety issue on yard. We will communicate this information to you via text or letter.

Families in need of Financial Assistance:

If parents require financial assistance in relation to their children's uniform, the school will consider each request on an individual basis and make a decision on the request based on family circumstances. This funding will be taken from our **DEIS** (Delivering Equality of opportunity in Schools) grant.



Monitoring and Reviewing:

The Principal, staff and Board of Management review this policy regularly.

Success Criteria

Practical indicators of the success of this policy will be evident in parents' satisfaction with uniform availability and children's comfort and consistency wearing their school uniform.

Ratification and Communication

This policy is communicated to pupils, staff and parents regularly.

The policy was ratified in 2011. The policy was reviewed in April 2022 and will be reviewed again in April 2024.
